



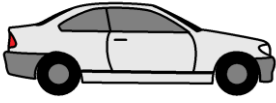

- sign a contract

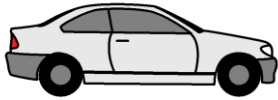
or

The Senior Master must agree to everything.



How to buy a car



Talk to your Trust Officer.



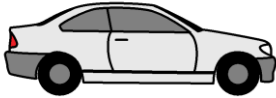
Your Trust Officer will talk to the Senior Master.

You need to show the Senior Master 6 things.



Your Trust Officer can help you.

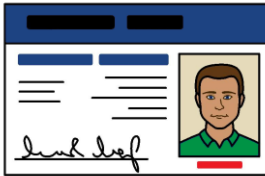
6 things you need to show



Tell your Trust Officer why you need a car.

For example, you

- use a walking stick. It is hard for you to walk to the shop
- need to drive to work
- use a wheelchair and want to go out with friends.



Current driver's licence for

- you
- and**
- other people who will drive the car.

For example,

- a carer
- your family.



Driver History Report from Vic Roads for

- you
- and**
- other people who will drive your car.



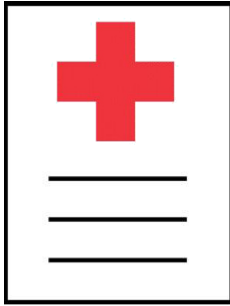
A Police check for all drivers.

This says if you have done a crime (for insurance).



Your Trust Officer will get a form from an insurance company.

This says the driver can get insurance.



Medical report from your usual doctor.

This says you are

- healthy
- and**
- safe to drive.

A medical report will say changes you need to your car. For example, a

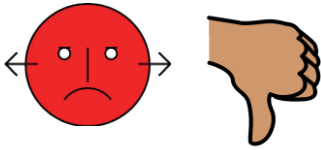
- knob on the steering wheel for
1 hand steering
- hoist for your wheelchair
- brake you can use with your hand.



Your Trust Officer will help you get these things.



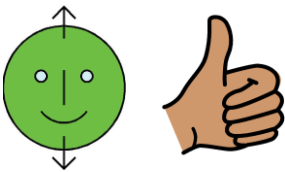
Your Trust Officer will give your paperwork to the Senior Master.



The Senior Master says **no**.

You can **not** buy a car

Talk to your Trust Officer.

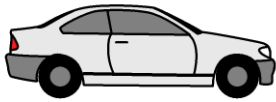


The Senior Master says **yes**.

You can look for a car.

The Senior Master will say

how much money you can spend.



Find the car you want



Your Trust Officer can help you.



Only go to a car yard dealer.

The Senior Master is more likely to say yes to a car yard dealer.



Wait. Do **not** sign a car contract yet.

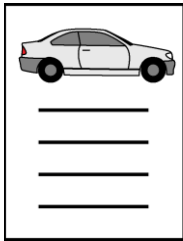


Your Trust Officer will get information about the car you want



For example,

- the cost



- a car report from a mechanic.

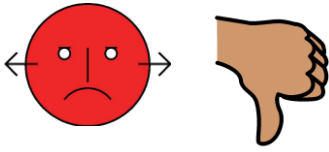
This will tell the Senior Master about the car.

For example,

- the engine is good
- the tyres are old
- there is rust under the car



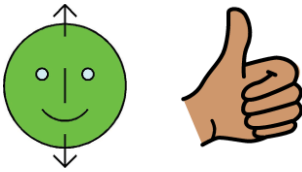
Your Trust Officer will give your information to the Senior Master.



The Senior Master says **no**.

You can not buy this car.

Talk to your Trust Officer.



The Senior Master says **yes**.

You can buy this car.



You need to sign a car contract.

You may have questions about the contract.



Ask your Trust Officer.

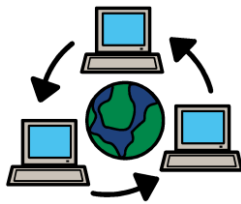
